



HOT WEATHER SAFETY TIPS FOR YOUR PET

THIS SUMMER

Remember always keep fresh cool water for your pet



NEVER LEAVE PET IN CAR

Never leave your pet alone in a vehicle. Even cracking the window an inch or two does not prevent the car, and the dog from getting overheated.



SIGNS OF A HEAT STROKE

Rapid panting, bright red tongue, thick saliva are the main symptoms you will see first. If this happens do not give dog a bath or soak them. Apply and reapply cold rags, use a fan to help dog cool down. Get to vet ASAP.

USE CANINE SUNSCREEN

SPF

If you and your dog are going to be out in the sun most of the day, you should apply sunscreen to them. You will need to get a canine safe sunscreen due to zinc being toxic for your pup.



FLEA AND TICK MEDICINE

Keep your pet safe and healthy by making sure they are up to date on there flea and tick medicine. Prevent your dog from contracting lyme disease.



DON'T SHAVE YOUR DOG

You can always trim your dogs hair but never completely shave them. Their fur helps prevent sunburn and keeps them from overheating.



WATER SAFETY

Never leave your dog unattended by bodies of water such as pools, oceans, or rivers. Not all dogs are good swimmers. Instead you could get a kiddie pool filled with a shallow amount of water, for your dog to cool off in.
